A Life Loved, A Life Lived

I got an email from someone asking if her best friend, Eileen, could have dog visits in her final months. As it turned out, Eileen lived where I work. When we met, she told me she had terminal cancer, had declined treatment, and was at peace with her decision. She just wanted to spend time with dogs again.

I arranged for teams to visit her weekly. We all quickly saw what a remarkable woman she was—caring, inspiring, and deeply dedicated to helping others. With each visit, we learned more about her incredible life. She always made time for the dogs, telling friends not to visit during those cherished moments.

As her condition worsened, Eileen remained calm and even excited for what came next. She chose death with dignity, and during that conversation, asked if we could organize a birthday lunch. Of course we could—by then, there wasn't anything I wouldn't do for her. She picked the place and her order: a soy cappuccino with honey and a BLT with a salad at a dog-friendly restaurant.

On July 12, we took her to lunch. She said goodbye to a few visitors before we left, noting how hard it was to say those last goodbyes. Over lunch, she shared stories, and when asked about regrets, said only if she had unknowingly hurt someone. That was Eileen—thoughtful to the end. She spoke of reuniting with her father and imagined all her past dogs running to greet her.

After lunch, she thanked us for spending time with her. Over the next two weeks, her calendar was full with visitors from near and far. Though she had no blood relatives, she was surrounded by love.

On July 26, she passed peacefully, exactly how and when she chose. This experience was far more than a volunteer assignment—it was a lesson in living with intention, advocating for yourself, and loving deeply. One I'll never forget.

Thank you, Eileen, for the wisdom—and to all the teams who gave her so much joy in her final months. She truly loved every moment.
