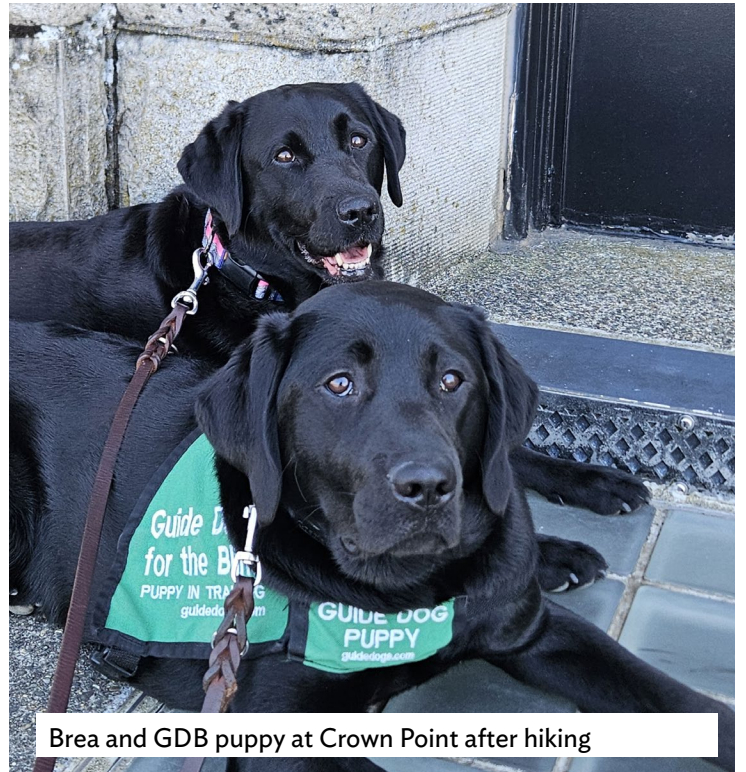

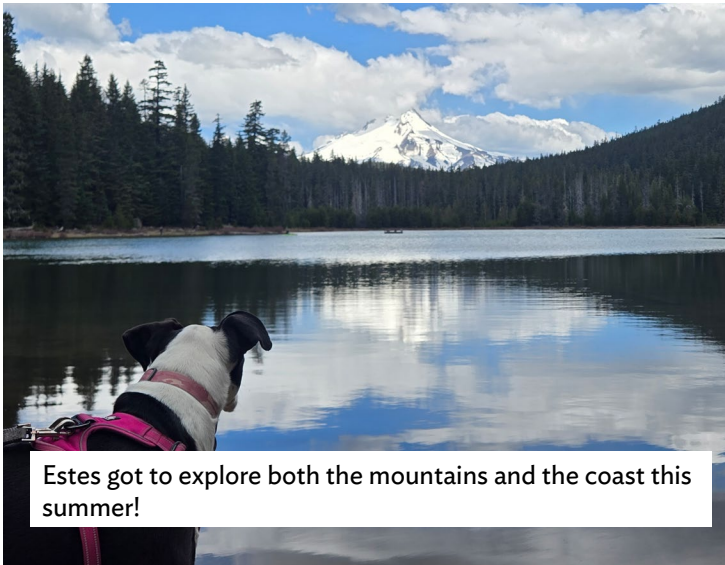

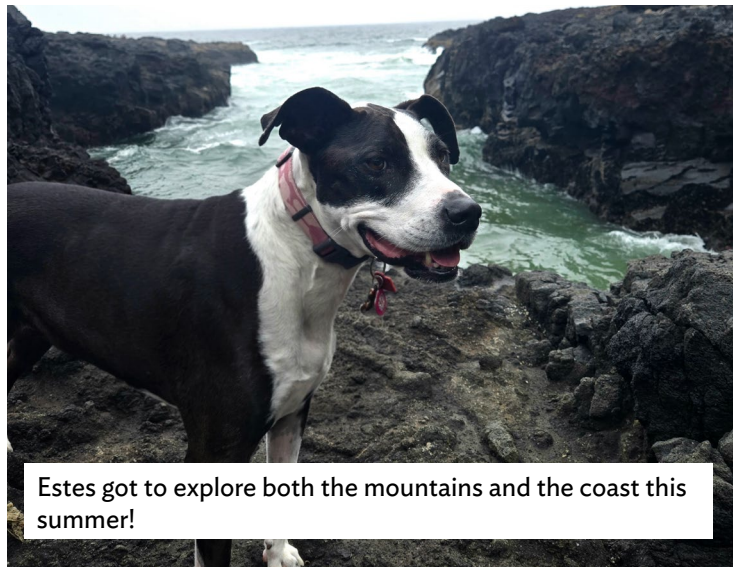

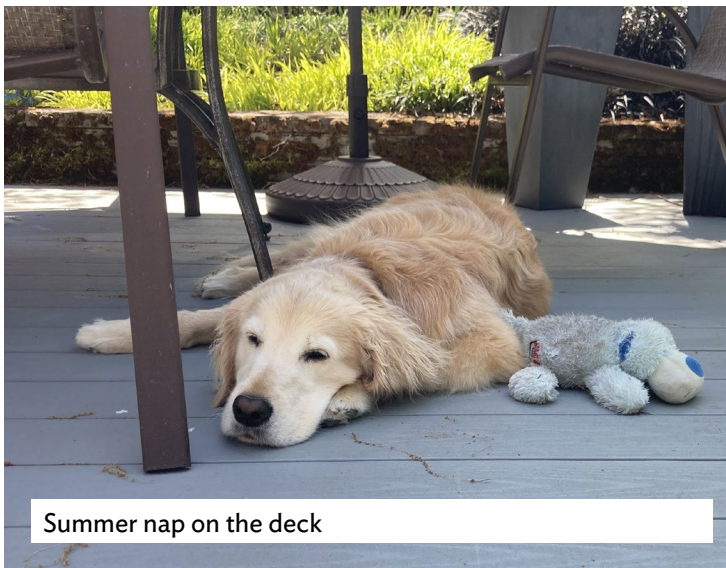

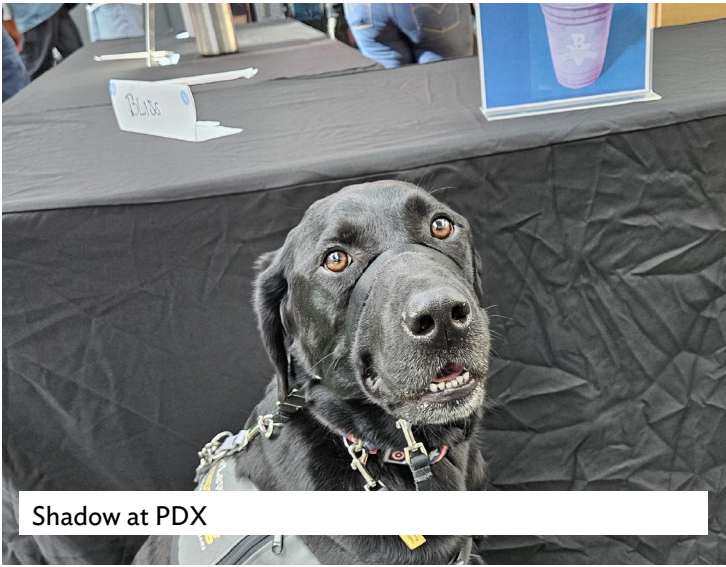

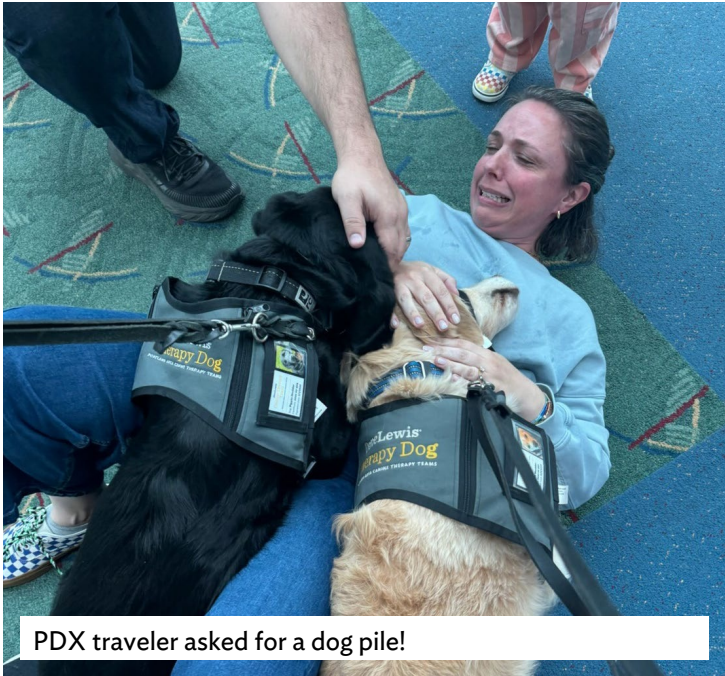

An Educational Visit for ATF Officers

Is it too much to ask a therapy dog to pretend they were impaled in the chest to teach life-saving field medicine to police officers? Not if you are a PACTT dog! I'm constantly in awe of these dogs and their people. On August 18 and 19, DoveLewis hosted 12 officers from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) from all around the nation for a two-day class on life-saving field medicine. All participants were handlers of explosive detection dogs that embark on missions at special events like the Super Bowl and World Cup across the country, in addition to specialized high-risk missions.

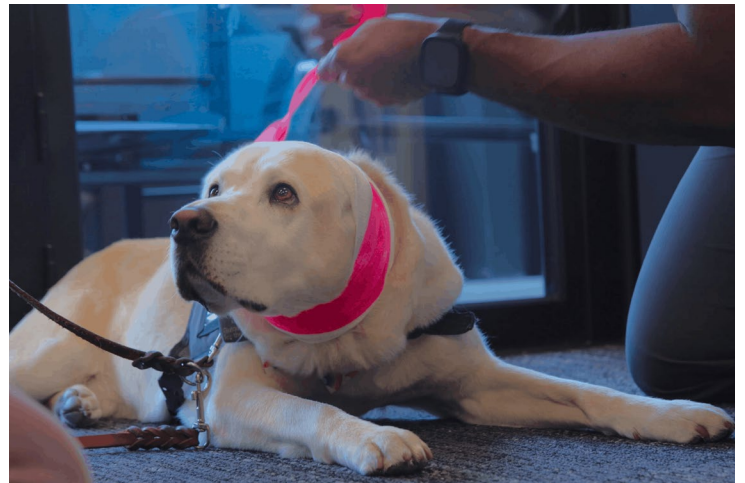
The first half of the training was a lecture led by me, discussing protocols of how to approach an injured working dog in the field. The best part was the hands-on portion involving the PACTT dogs. Our perfect volunteers, LisaLu and Houdini, graciously allowed officers to obtain vital signs and practice efficiently placing muzzles on them. They demonstrated great patience, and of course, lots of wags and love for the officers. They had head bandages and limb bandages placed and were happy to lie down for the training if there were treats involved.

Day two of training involved scenarios of injured dogs in the field, requiring the officers to think quickly and apply the skills they had learned. Frank, Archie, and Axel graciously sported a t-shirt with an adhered knife mimicking a stab wound to the chest, and a t-shirt with (balloon) eviscerated intestines mimicking an open abdominal wound. These dogs rolled over for their bandage placement and happily stood for their chest bandage. The dogs ended the day with pretend ear and leg lacerations, sporting even more head and limb bandages.

These dogs were willing to give up their dignity to save the lives of working dogs. I want to extend a huge thank you to Kathy W., Colleen, Dan, Cathy, and Megan for giving their time to this event. The officers and DoveLewis DVMs were all appreciative of your involvement and in awe of how wonderful, cooperative and loving your perfect dogs were. I am especially SO thankful for the support with these wacky things I ask you to do! I can't wait for the next training.

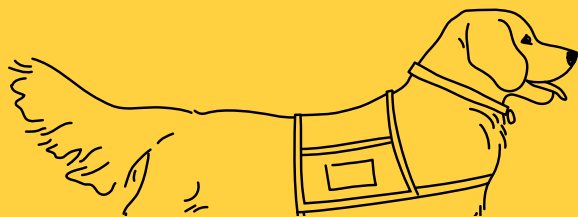
