















Honoring Roger

When Roger Schrinky crossed the rainbow bridge a few months ago, the loss was felt far beyond his own family. The elementary school he faithfully visited three days a week felt it deeply too. Roger wasn't "just a visiting dog" — he was part of their rhythm, their comfort, and their joy.

The framed outline of a dog filled with words from the second graders tells the story best. Each child was asked to share words that described Roger. The biggest and boldest words were the ones spoken most often — kind, soft, gentle, loving, happy. Roger lives on in those words.


A small group of six second graders went even further, creating a gravesite and the rear view of his tombstone. Their tender hearts wanted to honor him in a way that made sense to them. Another envelope holds nearly 30 handwritten notes and hearts, all for Roger — messages of love, gratitude and goodbye.

One especially touching gift was a 3D-printed "Roger" dog, complete with wings, lovingly created and given to Dan — a beautiful symbol of their belief that Roger is now watching over them. You can only imagine what that meant to receive.

And in a quiet, meaningful gesture, the principal shared with Dan that a monument to Roger is being planned for the school library, so his presence will always remain where he spent so much of his time listening and loving.

This is the impact of a therapy dog who shows up consistently, gently and wholeheartedly. Roger didn't just visit the school — he became part of its story. He helped children feel safe, seen and special.

Our teams make their visits personal and connected, and it's these remarkable dogs — with their steady hearts and wagging tails — who leave paw prints that remain long after they are gone. Roger's paw prints are everywhere in that school. And they always will be.
